An exciting Temporary Full-Time opportunity as an **Primary Care Nurse Practitioner (Competition #208.17)** exists in the Bay Centre for Birth Control Department reporting to the Director, Director, Primary Care & Health Equity

The Primary Care Nurse Practitioner provides leadership and collaborates with the physician group and the interprofessional team to develop, implement, monitor and evaluate client, and community centered programs and services. The successful candidate will model, promote, facilitate and evaluate primary care clinical practices supported by the best evidence and quality improvement initiatives. The Primary Care Nurse Practitioner collaborates in the implementation of strategic plans, evaluation and programming in alignment with the program goals.

With a commitment to patient safety as a key professional value and an essential component of daily practice, the NP provides assessment, treatment and evaluation utilizing specialized knowledge as it applies to the promotion of sexual and reproductive health. The Nurse Practitioner role at the Bay Centre for Birth Control and Special Treatment Clinic supports clients by providing an in depth understanding of the complex emotions and conflicting moral and cultural values that surround abortion and sexual health care.

This position requires a solid communicator with excellent conflict management, negotiation, and computer skills; proven ability to maintain confidentiality and ethics and to interpret and evaluate information in order to make appropriate clinical decisions. The successful candidate will possess sound knowledge of health promotion and disease prevention strategies, clinical therapeutics, community health care programs, services, agencies and referral physicians; as well as knowledge and experience in applying clinical assessment skills to lead to improved health outcomes, preferably in a hospital, community or public health setting.

Summary of Duties, but not limited to:

The successful candidate will perform duties within the scope of practice of the RN (EC) including conducting complete and focused physical assessments, communicating health findings and diagnoses, prescribing treatments and medications, ordering laboratory tests, and diagnostic ultrasounds. As well, they will provide health education and counseling to patients related to identified health issues; and consult and collaborate with other professional staff concerning clinical issues, as appropriate.

Other duties require the incumbent to provide leadership, teaching and functional guidance to professional staff and other learners from the interprofessional group, including Family Medicine Residents RNs and Nurse Practitioners; participate in the development, implementation and evaluation of policies, procedures and protocols; develop and administer a health care plan appropriate to client needs, including advocacy and referral to healthcare and/or social agencies, among others.

- Provides comprehensive nonjudgmental sexual health assessment, education, treatment and follow-up including pregnancy options information and abortion care.
- Assesses the physical, mental and emotional status of clients; provides emotional support, crisis

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counseling and follow-up with a particular emphasis on responding to disclosures of intimate partner abuse.

- Supports and facilitates Women's College Hospital's commitments to academic, research, teaching in an ambulatory care setting.
- Works collaboratively with nursing colleagues, physicians, allied health team, patient to provide integrative patient-focused care for patients of the Bay Centre team.
- Determines patient health care needs (in consultation with physician when required) through advanced history taking, physical examinations/interval assessments, and interpretation of diagnostic tests.
- Maintains accurate, complete electronic patient demographics and charts
- Tracks Clinic statistics.
- Works in collaboration with the health care team, to facilitate patient flow.
- Acts as a consultant and resource to nursing administration, medicine, members of the health care team and external groups in the process of decision-making, strategic planning and problem solving.
- Use ongoing evaluation of needs assessment to develop/initiate/modify the health care plan.
- Determine and implement required diagnostic testing and initiate (adjust and / or discontinue) pharmacological and non-pharmacological therapies as defined by the College of Nurses of Ontario RN (EC).
- Maintains leading edge nursing knowledge based on clinical research and literature review; contributes to nursing knowledge base through active participation in research or as a lead investigator; incorporates research into practice and shares knowledge by presentation and/or publications.
- Supervises NP/RN, medical and other students in their clinical experience and evaluates performance.
- Implements and monitors clinical guidelines, educates staff regarding clinical guidelines and acts as a resource for related issues and problem solving. Recommends Clinical guideline revisions as required.
- Acts as a change agent by advocating for and implementing new initiatives.
- Supports the strategic direction of the hospital and the strategic plan of nursing by being actively involved in hospital program committees.
- As a role model and champion you will work to identify and integrate safe, best practices into daily activities to foster the delivery of safe and exemplary care.
