The Nursing role is central to client care, education and research components for the Bay Centre for Birth Control and the Special Treatment Clinic. The RN reports to the Clinical Manager of the Bay Centre for Birth Control and the Special Treatment Clinic

Summary of Duties, but not limited to:

- Functions as a member of an inter-disciplinary team and works collaboratively utilizing a client centered approach
- Provides comprehensive nonjudgmental sexual health assessment, education, treatment and follow-up including; testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections and associated follow up care, pregnancy options information and abortion care.
- Assesses the physical, mental and emotional status of clients; provides emotional support, crisis counseling and follow-up with a particular emphasis on responding to disclosures of intimate partner abuse.
- Supports and facilitates Women's College Hospital's commitments to academic, research, teaching in an ambulatory care setting.
- Serves as a Champion by demonstrating a commitment to client care that is consistent with evidence based practice and in breaking down stereotypes of sexual differences and lifestyle choices; actively promotes care in an environment that supports persons regardless of their sexual orientation and identity.
- As part of a teaching hospital the RN will provide mentorship/preceptorship to new staff and students.

As a role model and champion you will work to identify and integrate safe, best practices into daily activities to foster the delivery of safe and exemplary care.
