Acute Ambulatory Care Unit (AACU)

The **WCH AACU** is a GIM-lead short stay medical unit run that provides:

- 1. Urgent assessment and management of acute medical illness
- 2. Management of exacerbations of chronic medical conditions
- 3. Rapid diagnostic work-up of a new medical problem
- 4. IV infusions

EXAMPLES OF MEDICAL PROBLEMS THAT CAN BE MANAGED IN THE AACU:

- Diagnosis of DVT/PE and initiation of low molecular weight heparin/warfarin
- IV antibiotics for cellulitis, pneumonia, diabetic foot infection
- Red cell transfusion for anemia
- IV lasix for congestive heart failure
- COPD/asthma exacerbation for steroid initiation and frequent bronchodilators
- Optimization of glycemic control in diabetes
- Management of new atrial fibrillation
- Work-up of syncope
- Work up of chest pain

REFERRAL CRITERIA:

- 1. Patient must be medically stable
- **2.** Management of medical condition achievable in 24 hours
- **3.** Patient able to come for outpatient followup

REFERRAL EXCLUSIONS:

- 1. Patient is medically unstable
- 2. Patient requires an inpatient admission
- **3.** Patient requires acute neurological consultation
- **4.** Patient requires surgical consultation
- **5.** Patient has end stage renal disease and is on dialysis
- 6. Patient has a G/J feeding tube

AVAILABLE SUPPORTS

- Laboratory investigations
- Radiology including x-ray, ultrasound, nuclear medicine, CT scan, MRI
- Non-invasive cardiac testing (stress test, echo, nuclear cardiac testing)
- Pulmonary function tests
- Allied health including occupational therapy, physiotherapy and social work
- Subspecialty support



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
