AMBLATORY SURGERY DISCHARGE

Ambulatory Surgery Discharge Instructions

Please refer to your surgeon's discharge instructions regarding your postoperative care.

You may notice a pink tinge on your skin where your surgery was performed, this is an antiseptic skin cleanser that can be removed with soap and water.

When to contact my doctor?

If you have excessive symptoms such as:

- Fever or chills (temperature above 38°C or 100.4°F)
 - Unusual drainage of fluid or excessive bleeding from your incision
 - Increasing tenderness, redness or swelling
 - Difficulty breathing
 - Sudden or severe pain, unresponsive to the prescribed pain medication
 - Excessive nausea or vomiting
- If for any reason, you are unable to reach your doctor, go to the emergency department at your surgeon's primary hospital or the closest emergency department.
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
